

SUMMER READING LIST: MODERN LANGUAGES (SPANISH) AND JOINT SCHOOLS WITH MODERN LANGUAGES (SPANISH)

Welcome to Oxford! Before you arrive, you should do three things. Firstly, read the texts you will be studying this year (start with Michaelmas Term, and follow with Hilary and Trinity in that order. Do not worry if you cannot read them all; prioritize reading the Michaelmas texts). Secondly, acquire a knowledge of the background to Spanish studies. Thirdly, acquire and familiarize yourself with a good grammar guide and a dictionary.

You can buy the texts you need from Amazon or Waterstones or from more specialised bookshops (Blackwell's, The European Languages Bookshop, or Grant and Cutler at Foyles). You can also check www.bookfinder.com for second-hand copies of the books. Make sure you buy the correct edition of the set texts (search or order via ISBN rather than author and title).
