





IMPACT

Quantitative analysis¹ demonstrates a statistically significant positive impact on all aspects measured including participants' understanding of university, student finance as well as A-level and degree choice.

¹ Calculated using a Wilcoxon signedrank test using the matched pre- and post-residential survey responses, which were given as 5- and 10-point scales in response to questions such as "Do you feel well equipped to choose a university course?" and "How much do you know about the following aspects of university?".
